


A community united and inspired by the arts

Arts and Culture in Douglas County 2020 Master Plan Update

Thanks to the many local arts supporters, there are new policies under Economic Development focus for the arts and culture.

3. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT POLICIES

- Increase opportunities for public art by recognizing the economic benefits of promoting public art and culture through increases in tourism, jobs for artists, and by creating a source of community pride.
- Promote cultural tourism, defined as "travel directed toward experiencing the arts, heritage, and special character of unique places."
- Ensure that the County's zoning and land use regulations support the development of live-work space for artists in a variety of settings around the county.

5. PUBLIC FACILITIES, SERVICES & RECREATION POLICIES

- Maintain clear and simple mechanisms by which the public can make donations for art, park and recreation improvements for public facilities and programs.
- Develop and maintain facilities which support the cultural and performing arts interests of our residents and visitors.
- Identify opportunities for studios, rehearsal halls, theaters and concert halls, dance rehearsal and performance spaces, exhibition spaces and galleries, multipurpose centers, classrooms, administrative offices and art storage facilities.

Two RFP's for Muralists – Carson City Visitor Center and "Welcome to Carson City" Murals

The Carson City Culture & Tourism Authority (CTA) is seeking a muralist with the goal to create a "Holy Smokes" moment for visitors to Carson City as they come into the Visitor Information Center. A successful design will have a visual depiction of the arts/culture/heritage/history of Carson City, the Capital of Nevada. The intent would be to highlight those icons/attractions/locations that mean something to Carsonites with the hopes that they catch the attention of our visitors as well. A full colored sketch of the proposed design is required as well as any explanations as deemed necessary by the artist.

Submission deadline is 5:00 pm on April 2, 2021

The Carson City Culture & Tourism Authority, Rotary Club of Carson City and the Consolidated Municipality of Carson City have partnered to solicit proposals from local artists to design and create a "Welcome to Carson City" mural to be featured on the north wall of the Carson City Visitor Information Center at 716 N. Carson St. Once installed, the piece will be owned by Carson City and added to its permanent art collection. All involved parties are looking for a design that will go with the established aesthetic of both the inside and outside of the building and each letter will depict an attribute of Carson City that will highlight what the City has to offer.
